Pretrial Data Act HB2689

Sponsored by Rep. Jehan Gordon-Booth

Bill Summary: The Pretrial Data Act calls for the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority (ICJIA) to collect key bond court and jail data from all Illinois counties and publish monthly reports. The bill calls for three separate reports with three sets of data: 1) Pretrial Order Report; 2) Pretrial Custody and Release Report; and 3) Pretrial Bail Proceeds Report.
