




CRUMBLING ROADS IMPACT US ALL:


Major state & local roads in poor condition

DRINKING WATER: MICHIGAN AT A CROSSROADS











2030 GOAL

- ROADS: Get 90% of state roads in good/fair condition and provide additional resources for local roads.
- DRINKING WATER: 100% of communities with clean drinking water.

THE SOLUTION

Phase in fuel tax of 15 cents per gallon every six months from October 1, 2019 through October 1, 2020

RELIEF

- Increase Earned Income Tax Credit to ease transition for vulnerable families.
- Repeal the retirement tax.
- Lower the cost Michiganders spend on car repairs.








Funding for service line replacements, research and treatment for PFAS, and research to optimize water distribution systems.
